Barry studied architecture at North London Polytechnic (now London Metropolitan University).

His early career was spent with Powell and Moya where he worked on many high profile projects including Chichester Festival Theatre and The Museum of London as well as housing projects in London.

In 1973 Barry moved to Phippen Randall and Parkes (PRP) where he spent the remainder of his professional career. He designed many major housing projects in the New Towns and large inner city housing schemes before leading the company's move into urban regeneration in the 1990's. He became Chairman of the practice in 2000 and led its expansion into new areas of work including project management and sustainable design. He co-authored a book about the work of the practice entitled Place and Home. In the early 1990s he opened the practice's City of London office above the Smithfield Market where it remains to this day.

His wider interests have included housing prefabrication and he has taken part in study tours to Scotland, Scandinavia and Japan to study industrialised methods.

He has undertaken research on behalf of the London Housing Federation into high density housing in Europe. He contributed to the publication 'Super Density' produced by Design for Homes in 2007 and a number of other studies into sustainable urban development including Beyond Eco –Towns.

He was a board member of The Housing Forum for over 10 years and was Chairman from 2010 until 2014. He led several working groups on housing delivery and was co-author with Dr Nicholas Falk of The ABC of Housing Growth and Infrastructure.

He has been an active member of The Worshipful Company of Chartered Architects since 2004 and was elected as Master in 2018. His major project over the past two years has been to organise a lavishly illustrated new book on "The Livery Halls of the City of London". This is due for publication in October 2018.

His leisure interests include painting, drawing and wood engraving. He regularly attends Summer School courses at the Heatherly School in Lots Road, Chelsea. Sporting interest include golf (RAC) and football (Chelsea FC). He is an opera and theatre enthusiast and enthusiastically supports Opera Holland Park and their Young Artists Programme.

Barry and his wife Jane have homes in Kensington and Norfolk. They have four children and eight grandchildren.
