Chloë has spent her working life in the energy business, having joined Gulf Oil as a college-leaver in 1979. Prior to Chevron's take-over of Gulf in 1984, Chloë worked with the blending and distribution of automotive, industrial and marine lubricants throughout Europe, Africa and the Middle East. After the take-over, Chloë moved into the aviation fuels and fluids department, with responsibilities for direct marketing, as well as logistical functions. In 1988, a six-month stint in Chevron's San Francisco HQ saw a transition to marine fuels marketing and thence, via some ISO 9000 certification work, into Chevron's international LPG Trading & Transportation Division.

After further merger and acquisition activity, in 2003 Chloë joined private New York based trading company Trammo, where, amongst other responsibilities, she is responsible for the operation and financial management of the LPG trading and shipping division.

Having been awarded Freedom of the Company by presentation in 2005, Chloë became a Liveryman of the Worshipful Company of Fuellers in 2007 and was elected to the Court in 2010. She is honoured to have been elected to the position of xxx of the Fuellers; the "Energy" Company of the City of London.

She is Treasurer and a Trustee of City of London Sea Cadets and Vice-Chairman of her local Residents' Association in Buckinghamshire. Her interests include rugby (Wales, Wasps and Maidenhead) and most other sports, reading (particularly Tudor history), music, gardening and dog-walking.
