Rodney Jagelman was educated at Tiffin School, Kingston upon Thames and Emmanuel College, Cambridge.

His career has been almost entirely in the City starting as a trainee actuary and qualifying with Bacon & Woodrow and subsequently as a partner. Latterly he has worked with the Law Debenture team of professional pension trustees retiring on 31st July 2018. As such he represented the firm as an Independent, sometimes as chair, on the Trustee Board of a number of Company pension schemes of various types with assets of up to 2 billion.
